

Dr. T.V. Sekher is Professor in the Department of Population Policies and Programs at the International Institute for Population Sciences (IIPS), Mumbai. Trained in Demography and Sociology, his areas of research interests are social demography, gender issues, public health, and population ageing. Dr. Sekher was a Visiting Fellow at the Wellcome Trust Centre at UCL, London (2003), Maison de Sciences la Homme, Paris (2004), Lund University, Sweden (2005) and at Oxford Brooks University, UK (2009). He also served as a Consultant to UNFPA-India (2009-10) and Population Foundation of India

(2013) to review financial incentives schemes for girl children in India and South Asia. He is presently Co-Principal Investigator of two major ageing and health surveys in India-Longitudinal Ageing Study in India-LASI (jointly undertaken by IIPS, Harvard School of Public Health and University of Southern California) and the Study on Global Ageing and Adult Health- SAGE (sponsored by WHO). Dr. Sekher is one of the National Coordinators of the District Level Household and Facility Survey (DLHS) for the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, to generate health and family welfare indicators for all districts of India, based on survey of 600,000 households. He is presently directing a study for UNFPA and Govt. of India to examine the effectiveness of conditional cash transfer (CCT) schemes for the welfare of girls. He is also the Managing Editor of the professional journal- Demography India. He is presently the General Secretary of Indian Association for Social Sciences and Health (IASSH) and office bearer of Indian Association for the Study of Population (IASP) during 2011-15. He is also member of IUSSP and PAA, and on the Editorial Advisory Board of Asian Population Studies.
